I have written and rewritten this introduction honoring Pride month half a dozen times over the past two weeks as the world around us seems to keep catching fire, literally and figuratively. COVID-19 brought many parts of our lives screeching to a halt, from birthday parties to haircuts, to job losses. Meanwhile, the systemic struggles of so many have been amplified and exacerbated. COVID-19 has not stopped or even slowed racism, classism, ableism, sexism, homophobia, or political partisanship.
