Staying Proud in Tough Times

As the last few weeks of the strangest summer of my lifetime come to an end, I am reflecting on the impact that the events of the past several months have had on LGBTQIA+ communities, BIPOC communities, and our world at large. In the same month of June that we celebrated pride and took a step forward together to protect LGBTQIA+ workers from employment discrimination, we saw our health care threatened. As the days in July and August heated up so did the social and political tensions in our communities. We are now hearing daily news of death, violence, and division that continues to harm the same people disproportionately. I'll admit, hope feels a little harder to find. The multifaceted and deeply-rooted wicked problems we are confronting at this moment in government call for more than quick fixes and sound bites. Our communities need us to dig in and do the hard work of truly and holistically examining our systems and the change necessary to better realize the priorities and values of the people.

In the midst of it all, I find inspiration in the stories of all of us. Our stories teach us that we can overcome seemingly impossible obstacles because we have done it before. While we are all different, we have common threads—tales of perseverance and determination drowning out evil, the power of people working together, the quiet strength that comes when the only direction left to us is survive and rebuild. I believe one way we can stay proud in tough times is through listening to and telling our stories—the true, complex, sometimes

queer authors, Dorothy Allison, said it best: "Two or three things I know for sure, and one of them is that to go on living I have to tell stories, that stories are the one sure way I know to touch the heart and change the world." In a time when it is hard to find answers to the problems in front of us, may we seek to find connections through our stories. I hope you'll join us in that effort this fall.
